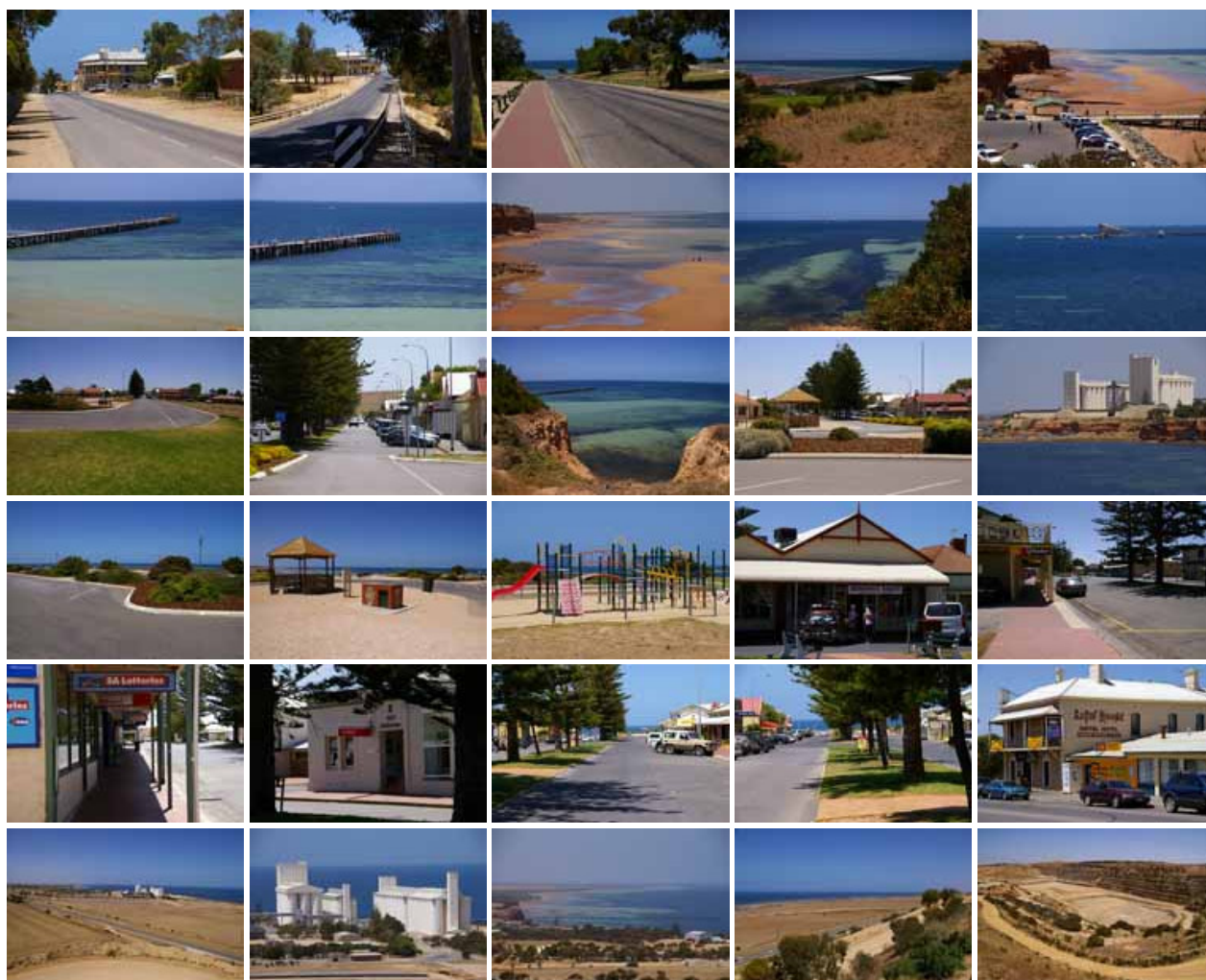

CARAVAN PARK



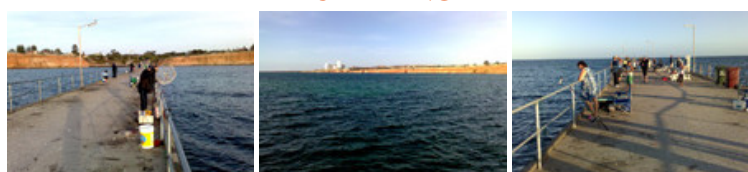

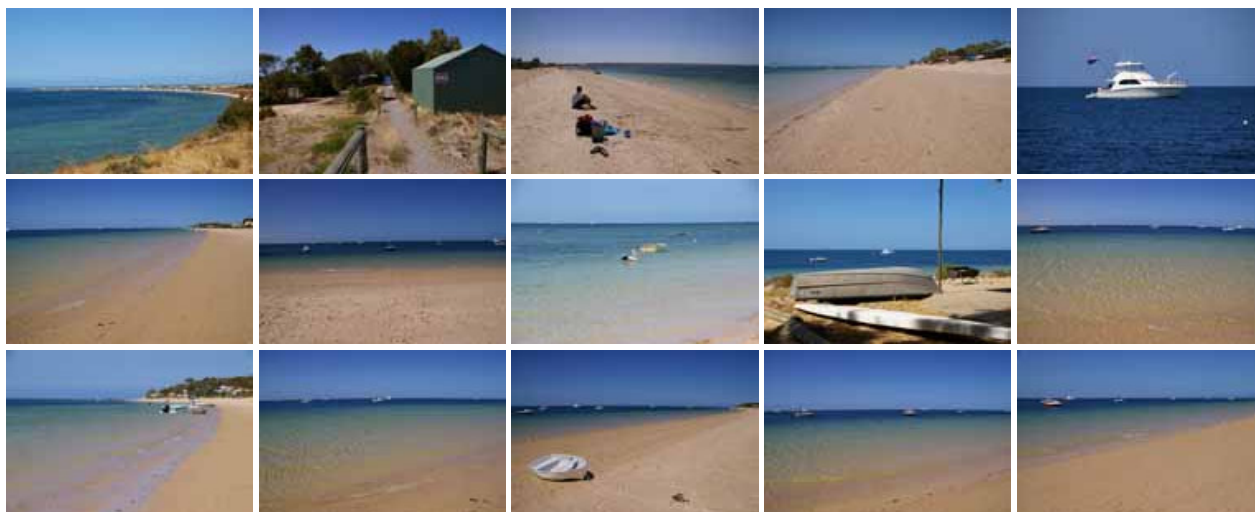
CRABBING
