Burra Creek Campground - June 1st 2007 until June 3rd 2007.

Burra Creek Gorge is a large campground located 23kms out from Burra South Australia on the Robertstown to Burra road.

Fri 1st & Sat 2nd June 2007: We were all packed and on the road at 7.05am. As we looked at the sky, we both wondered if it was going to be suitable weather to be going away bush camping. As we got closer to our destination, it was evident that we had made the right decision to go as the sky was breaking up and the sun starting to shine. Two hours later, we arrived at the Burra Creek campground to see other caravans had already arrived some time ago. After a quick drive around to choose a good location, we were soon set up for the weekend.

Refreshed and out of bed, we waited for Bruce and Maree to arrive just after 4.00pm. The only rain that we had for the entire weekend, was a small misty shower which kept us under cover on the Friday night for about ten minutes and again on Saturday for about two minutes.

Burra Creek campground offers a very large camping area for a small donation which is located at the entrance where the sealed road finishes. There are a number of drop pit toilets scattered throughout the campground, but there are no shower facilities. A number of spots along the creek has permanent water all year round. Fires are permitted when the fire season has ended although you will need to bring your own wood as there is none to be found.
