Tanunda is situated 70 kms from Adelaide in the Barossa Valley.

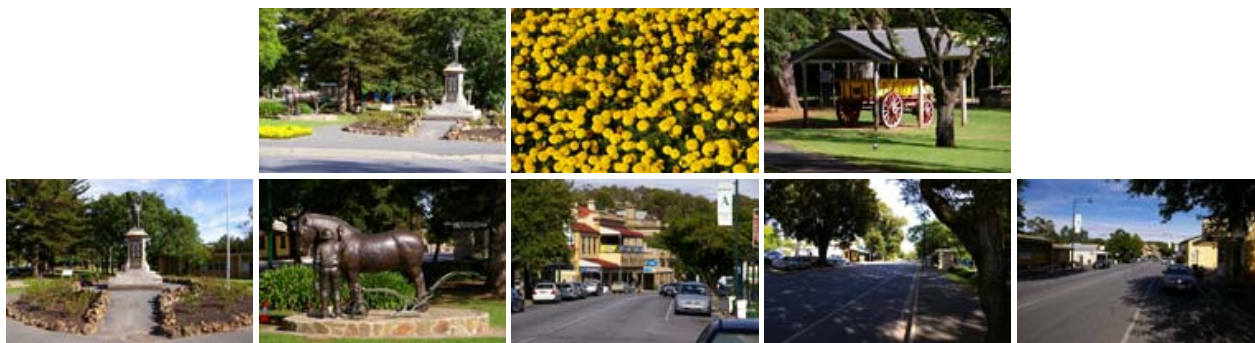
